

How do I keep my cases clean?

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched surfaces to eliminate bacteria, dirt and viruses.

We recommend sanitizing your cases with cleaning solutions or wipes. Make sure to wipe them down thoroughly between uses. We tested various wipes and here is what we recommend:

Preparation: Before cleaning, make sure to turn off and unplug any electronic devices housed in the cases. This will prevent any potential damage or electrical hazards.

Cleaning Solutions: You can use a variety of cleaning solutions to sanitize the cases. Some options include isopropyl alcohol, diluted household disinfectants, or specialized electronics cleaning solutions. Check the manufacturer's instructions for any specific recommendations or restrictions.

Frequency: It is recommended to clean your cases regularly, especially in high-traffic or shared environments. The frequency of cleaning will depend on the usage and surrounding conditions, but a weekly or bi-weekly cleaning routine should be sufficient in most cases

Wiping Down: Moisten a clean, lint-free cloth or disinfectant wipe with the chosen cleaning solution. Gently wipe down the exterior surfaces of the case, paying attention to areas that are frequently touched or prone to collecting dust. Avoid excessive moisture, especially around ventilation openings or sensitive areas.

Drying: After wiping down the case, allow it to air dry naturally. This will **help prevent streaks or residue** from forming. Avoid using heat sources or direct sunlight to speed up the drying process, as excessive heat can deform or warp the case.

Thoroughness: Ensure that you thoroughly clean all sides, corners, and edges of the case to remove any dirt, grime, or germs. Take care not to apply excessive pressure or scrub aggressively, as it may scratch or damage the plastic surface.
